

If any teacher gets rating A (i.e. four marks) on all the eight parameters, then the maximum score that can be obtained by him/her is 160.In this manner, total score for each teacher is calculated by counting the number of A's, B's, C's and D's received by the teacher and considering maximum score as 160, percentage score for each teacher is obtained.

Thus on the basis of data collected, percentage score for each faculty was obtained. The frequency distribution of percentage scores for the sessions 2017-18 of the teachers in the institute was prepared. The list of teachers along with the final score is submitted to the principal. Pie diagram is drawn from this frequency distribution.







After analysing part B it had been found that all other departments declared the result of the test within 2 weeks of the examination was conducted.








Average of the overall statement of student:




